

NCAVC SUPPORT

The National Center for the Analysis of Violent Crime (NCAVC) accomplishes its mission through the support in expertise of the five BAUs:



BAU-1: Counterterrorism & Threat Assessment

Provide behaviorally-based investigative and operational support to complex and time-sensitive crimes and other matters of significance involving acts or threats of violence.

BAU-2: Cyber Crimes & Counterintelligence

Provide critical operational support to complex cyber and counterintelligence investigations.

BAU-3: Crimes Against Children

Provide behaviorally-based investigative and operational support to complex and time-sensitive crimes and other matters of significance involving crimes perpetrated against child victims.

BAU-4: Crimes Against Adults & Violent Criminal Apprehension Program (ViCAP)

Provide behaviorally-based investigative and operational support to complex and time-sensitive crimes and other matters of significance involving crimes perpetrated against adult victims.

BAU-5: Research & Program Management

Provide support to BAU Coordinators in FBI field offices and personnel in the four operational units, working closely with each BAU to set strategy for NCAVC to ensure that it remains on the cutting edge of behaviorally-based investigations and analysis.



NATURE OF APPOINTMENT

The participant will not enter into an employee/ employer relationship with Oak Ridge Institute for Science and Education (ORISE), Oak Ridge Associated Universities (ORAU), Department of Energy (DOE), Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI), Critical Incident Response Group (CIRG), or any other office or agency. Instead, the participant will be affiliated with ORISE for the administration of the appointment through the ORISE letter of appointment and Terms of Appointment.

WHERE WILL I BE LOCATED?

The CIRG ORISE research fellowship is located near Quantico, Virginia.

FBI EMPLOYMENT REQUIREMENTS

Applicants must meet all FBI Employment Requirements, pass an FBI Background Investigation, and receive a Secret Security Clearance. There are specific elements that will automatically disqualify job candidates for employment with the FBI. HOW TO APPLY

The research fellowship is an FBI-sponsored education program in partnership with the Oak Ridge Associated Universities (ORAU) and is administered by the Oak Ridge Institute of Science and Education (ORISE). Qualified applicants must apply directly to ORISE. The final selection is made by FBI CIRG.

BACKGROUND

The Oak Ridge Institute of Science and Education (ORISE) research program provides opportunities for current students and recent graduates to apply their education and training to applied research.

Under the guidance of a mentor, you will support applied social/behavioral sciences research projects related to criminal, national security, or cyber threats; judge the completeness and accuracy of research results; perform statistical analyses on data; and prepare written manuscripts for FBI review and publication in peer-reviewed journals.

WHAT WILL I BE DOING?

As a research fellow with the Critical Incident Response Group (CIRG) Oak Ridge Institute for Science and Education (ORISE) Research Participation Program, you will enhance your professional development and increase your data collection capabilities by participating in research initiatives under the mentorship of CIRG research personnel. The ORISE Research Program will expose you to a work environment in a high security government facility and provides an opportunity to perform research in areas of interest unique to law enforcement and national security. Under the guidance of a mentor, you may be involved in the following:

- Conducting searches of scientific literature.
- Designing social/behavioral sciences research projects related to criminal, national security, and/or cyber threats.
- Conducting statistical analysis of data.
- Preparing and presenting research findings to diverse audiences, both orally and in writing.



PARTICIPANT BENEFITS

As a research fellow, you will receive a stipend as support for your living and other expenses. Stipend rates are determined by the CIRG officials and are based on your academic and professional background. The initial appointment is for one year but may be renewed upon recommendation of FBI contingent on the availability of funds, for up to five years.

CAREER PATHS FOR CIRG ORISE PARTICIPANTS

Research fellows can spend up to five years in the CIRG Research Participation Program. After completing their appointments, many of our research fellows go on to work full-time for the FBI and other government agencies, including, but not limited to, the State Department, the Secret Service, and the Department of Defense. Others work in research and law enforcement-related positions in academia, state and local law enforcement agencies, private industry and not-for-profits.

QUALIFICATIONS

You must meet the following criteria to participate in the program:

- Be a U.S. Citizen.
- Be currently pursuing or have completed requirements for a Bachelor's, Master's, or PhD within the last 5 years. For applicants currently pursuing a Master's degree or PhD, the applicant must be within one year of completing their degree.
- For applicants currently pursuing a Bachelor's degree, the applicant must complete all degree requirements by the start of the appointment.
- Undergo an extensive FBI background investigation and meet suitability criteria.
- Applicants with education or professional experience in computer science, cyber security, or information technology are particularly encouraged to apply.
